Welcome to the first edition of the CNCF newsletter for 2011

This year will mark our second year in the Cochrane Collaboration which means a busy year ensuring we continue with all our 2010 activities as well as launching a range of new initiatives. The Field is growing fast and we hope to continue our mission of improving health care outcomes by increasing the use of the Cochrane Library by nurses and others involved in nursing care.

Interesting Cochrane Fact

In 2010, the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews received an Impact Factor of 5.653 in the 2009 Journal Citation Reports, a 9% rise on the previous year. It is estimated that in 2009 The Cochrane Library was searched every second, an abstract was viewed every two seconds, and a full text Cochrane Review was downloaded every three seconds!

IJNP CNCF Section

December 2010 saw the 3rd instalment of the CNCF Section in the International Journal of Nursing Practice. Features were on the clinical trials database node, the traditional Chinese node as well as an article on understanding statistical data used in systematic reviews. Please check it out.

Reminder: CNCF Mentorship Program

The Review Support/CRG Liaison node has continued its work on developing a mentorship program. The aim of the program is to establish links between novice systematic review authors with those more experienced in order to expand the number of nursing care-related Cochrane reviews and to enhance experiences of novice review authors. This in turn has the potential to enhance the capacity to perform systematic reviews in the nursing profession.
