# Coding of Nursing-Care-**Relevant Cochrane Reviews**

A reminder that the CNCF has started to tag Cochrane reviews that are relevant to nursing care. Currently we are focusing on reviews completed in the last 18 months and have tagged relevant reviews using a twotiered system: by their primary specialty and their fundamental of care. The aim of this work is to facilitate better access to Cochrane Reviews to nurses and those involved in nursing care
