The Honours list provides national and formal recognition for a selected few Australians across the nation who have made a significant difference to their communities.

CNCN Nodes

The convenors of the CNCN nodes have a scheduled teleconference for the middle of February where they will discuss the progress of nodes and future activities. We will give you an update on the outcome of this meeting in our next edition.

An update from our Fundamentals of Care Node:

The CNCN Fundamentals of Care Node continues to make steady progress. Alison Kitson and Suzi Robinson-Malt, the co-leads of the Node will be attending two meetings in Oxford at the end of February where they will be discussing the position paper which outlines how we define the fundamentals of care. Yvonne Wengstrom, Professor of Cancer Care, Deputy Director Research and Development, Cancer Care Research Centre, University of Stirling & Associate Professor, Department of Neurobiology, Care Science and Society, Division of Nursing, Karolinska Institutet, Tiffany Conroy, Lecturer, Discipline of Nursing, School of Population Health and Clinical Practice, University of Adelaide and Joanne Profetto-McGrath Professor of Nursing Faculty of Nursing, University of Alberta, all volunteers in the node have been working with Alison and Suzi on the paper. Following these meetings we hope to share the paper with all volunteers in the node and work with them to set up a work plan.

CNCN Evidence Transfer Program (ETP) Update

We are receiving a lot of interest from our members wanting to be involved in developing summaries for the ETP program. Members who sign up to the ETP receive emails from the CNCN about opportunities to develop summaries before they are sent out to the wider membership and they are being snapped up very quickly. We have also now sent off our first submissions to the American Journal of Nursing and the Renal Society of Australasia Journal. We hope they will be as impressed as we were with them.

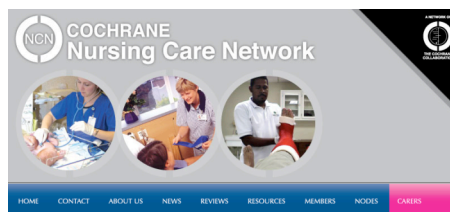
